A PROCLAMATION OF "ENGINEERS' WEEK"

- WHEREAS, the many contributions of the science and art of engineering and its hundred basic sciences have been essential to the progress and well-being of the world; and
- WHEREAS, this nation's contribution of a marvelous capacity to produce, which so astonished the world in the recent war and directly aided in our victory, was based on the application of sound engineering principles by competent and industrious engineers; and
- WHEREAS, the engineering profession is now engaged in directing this great productive capacity, this resourcefulness and ingenuity, into channels of peaceful activity which will give new and better opportunities for convenience, comfort, utility and safety; and
- WHEREAS, the engineers of our state have displayed great skill, honest devotion to high standards of professional responsibility and have earned, thereby, the respect, gratitude, and commendation of our people;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, LUTHER W. YOUNGDAHL, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week beginning on February 23, 1947 as

"ENGINEERS' WEEK"

and urge all citizens to pay tribute to our engineers and their many accomplishments and, if possible, to visit the Engineering Exhibit in the Minneapolis Armory, in order to view exhibits of the newest achievements of engineers.
