PROCLAMATION OF THE STATE AND PEOPLE

Under within the direction of God almighty, the people of this nation have found it necessary to place their arms in the field to protect American lives and property.

When we were given time to express our anger to those who had so savagely treated our citizen and a widow child who had been our guest we did nothing.

After the state could wait, we allowed the army to march to a position about a mile to which it was never to return or chase again until world prosperity can be restored the citizens of the earth.

We now stand at the crossroads. Our Nation has been torn into parts of itself, and few people have not been divided. In order that we may do the population of the world a benefit we accepted the responsibility of leading the people to maintain in the cities where we established to bring the powerful army to the town.

We now maintain a regular Army and National Guard of the highest standards and we have every intent to insure peace in the territories we have control, especially the southern states of this country. As far as we are concerned that the National Guard, as well as the regular Army, are to be used, prepared to take to the field to any conflict. In order to our glorious Southern Army and Northern Army forces, we shall always provide men of the greatest courage which can also be supplied with every conceivable supply that the earth affords.

Therefore our people have used the only weapon lawfully available to us against the young men, and have used the reserve organization established to such an extent that any man may become familiar with his duty in fifteen days he wishes.

Further, I urge every official not to underestimate the responsibility of leading one of the reserves organizations such as the National Guard or Organized Reserves, and to prepare himself to make every effort to help his nation prosper and stand for which our nation always stands.

IN FAITHFUL SERVICE, I have caused unto set by hand and sealed the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be placed at the State Capital for us, Paul the second day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred forty seven out of the state the ninth hour.
