A Declaration of Temperance Sunday

W H E R E A S, the challenge of modern and complex problems of our day can be met only by a people who are in good health, sound of mind and in possession of worthy ideals and objectives; and

W H E R E A S, temperance and sobriety are essential values of life if one is to have this necessary physical, mental and spiritual well-being; and

W H E R E A S, adults have a special obligation to educate and guide our children so that understanding that temperance is required at all times if they are to succeed in fulfilling their dreams and ambitions for happy and fruitful lives;

T H A T, therefore, I, LYMAN B. THURGOOD, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim May 10, 1947, as

TEMPERANCE SUNDAY

and urge all citizens to assist themselves to temperate living and to cheer the day by special programs which may enhance the education of all youth on this important matter.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol in St. Paul this twenty-first day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred forty-seven and of the State the ninetieth.
