PETITION FOR THE INCORPORATION OF THE VILLAGE OF MAPLE PLAIN.

To the Honorable Board of County Commissioners of Hennepin County, Minn.

We, the undersigned voters, residing within the territory proposed for incorporation hereinafter set forth, do hereby petition your Honorable Body, to call an election for the determination of the incorporation of the territory and resident population thereon, into a Village, and in pursuance thereof, we do hereby represent to your Honorable Body that the Boundaries of the territory proposed to be incorporated are as follows:

* All that part of Sections 23, 24, 25 and 26 in Township 116, North, Range 24 West of the Fifth principal Meridian described as follows:
Commencing at the Northwest corner of the Southwest quarter of the Southeast quarter of Section 23, thence South to the Southwest corner of the Northwest quarter of the ^{Northwest} quarter of Section 26; thence East to the center of the Northeast quarter of Section 25; thence North to the Northernly limit line of the Great Northern Railway; thence Southeasterly along said Railway limit line to the East line of said Section 25, thence North to a point twenty-six and two thirds Rods North of the Northeast corner of the Southeast quarter of the Southeast quarter of Section 24, thence West eighty Rods, thence South twenty-six and two thirds Rods to the center of the Southeast quarter of said Section 24, thence West to the Southeast corner of the Northeast quarter of the Southeast quarter of Section 23, thence South to the Northernly limit line of the Great Northern Railway, thence Northwesterly along said ^{south} Great Northern Limit line to the North and South center line of the ^{south} Southeast quarter of Section 25, thence North to the center of said South east quarter of said Section 25, thence West to place of beginning.

* That the quantity of land embraced in said territory is four hundred and sixty-seven acres.

* That no part of said territory described is within any incorporated Village,
