A Declaration of Naval Reserve Day

WHEREAS, a strong practical Naval Reserve is vital if America is to do its full part in maintaining the peace and, our Navy, accordingly, has created a civilian Naval Reserve to train sufficient young citizens to ensure this strength, and this program is of tremendous value to our country and to our State in preparing our young citizens for the responsibilities of later life; and

WHEREAS, the Navy and Naval Reserve are endeavoring to enroll into the Reserve sufficient young people to ensure these important aims; and the full participation of this State is necessary to the success of this national enrollment; and, the President of the United States has seen fit to appoint specific dates for national recognition and observance of the campaign; now

THUS, I, ARTHUR W. YOUNGDAHL, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby designate and proclaim that the period from May 15th to May 25, 1947, inclusive, be recognized and observed throughout this State as Naval Reserve Day, and the Sunday of May 25th as Naval Reserve Day.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol in St. Paul this twenty-ninth day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred forty-seven and of the State the ninetieth.
