

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO APPLY FOR SURVEY

OF AN ISLAND IN ALBERT LEA LAKE

FREEBORN COUNTY, MINNESOTA.

Notice is hereby given that it is the intention of Carl E. Arneson, surviving son of Andrew Arneson, deceased, to apply for a survey of public land of the United States, located in Freeborn County, Minnesota, described as follows, viz:

Beginning at a point that is 1658 feet due east from the 1/4 corner between Sections 13, and 24, Township 102, N. Range 21 W. of the 5th P.M., said above described point being on the section line between said Sections 13 and 24, and is place of beginning; thence North $1^{\circ}57'$ E. 189 feet; thence N $5^{\circ}12'$ W. 250 feet; thence N. $15^{\circ}41'$ E. 100 feet; thence N. $37^{\circ}29'$ E. 227 feet; thence S. $11^{\circ}33'$ E. 250 feet; thence S. $22^{\circ}34'$ E. 250 feet; thence S. $40^{\circ}53'$ E. 500 feet; thence S. $58^{\circ}56'$ W. 285 feet; thence N. $74^{\circ}12'$ W. 200 feet; thence N. $53^{\circ}44'$ W. 100 feet; thence N. $27^{\circ}43'$ W. 198 feet to the place of beginning.

Said described tract is an island but at times during the year when the water is not too high, it is connected to the adjoining mainland by a narrow road constructed and maintained by the applicant and by his father, prior to his death.

Said Andrew Arneson located and settled on said island in 1885 and lived there and improved the same until his death on June 29, 1929. Hilda Arneson, Dora Arneson, Carl E. Arneson and Betsey Arneson, all children of said Andrew Arneson, deceased still reside thereon.

The land opposite the island and to which said land the above referred to road connects, is surveyed. The tract described as:

Lot 1 in Subdivision of Government Lots 3 and 4 of Section 24, Township 102, Range 21,

is directly to the south of said island and it is owned by applicant Carl E. Arneson. Lots 2 and 3 of said subdivision, immediately to the south of said Lot 1, are still of record in the name of said Andrew Arneson.

It appears that said island is not shown on the Government surveys but it has been improved by said Arnesons by the placing of buildings thereon and cultivation of the soil for over fifty years.

You are hereby notified that any protests against the proposed survey should be filed with the Commissioner of the General Land Office, Washington,
