EXECUTIVE ORDER

Proclamation of Disabled Veterans Day

WHEREAS, the State of Minnesota has furnished more men per capita to the Marine Corps than any other state for two wars, and

WHEREAS, the Minnesota Detachment of the Marine Corps began pay out on the day of August 7, Constitutional Day, or Disabled Veterans Day, and

WHEREAS, on that day the Marine Corps will carry on its campaign of Disabled Veterans Day for the raising of funds to provide aid and services to Disabled Veterans. These aids and services are more than financial assistance alone and include services of supplying records, gaining recognition, and aiding rehabilitation of Marine veterans.

BEFORE ME, JAMES W. YOUNGDAHL, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim August 7, 1947, as

DISABLED VETERANS DAY

and call upon the citizens of this state to be generous in their help and thus honor the great contribution and sacrifice of those Marines who were disabled in executing the will of duty of their country.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol in St. Paul this thirtieth day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred forty-seven and of the state the nineteenth.
