A Proclamation of United Nations Week

WHEREAS, a little more than two years have elapsed since the United States and fifty other nations joined in signing that great Declaration of interdependence known as the charter of the United Nations; and

WHEREAS, the United Nations offers to the war-weary people of the world an organization which can provide justice in resolving disputes between nations and become the foundation for the construction of a lasting peace; and

WHEREAS, the United Nations can succeed in the attainment of its worthy objectives only if an enlightened people give it their continuous support and persistent attention; and

WHEREAS, America, the home of the United Nations, has a special responsibility to provide a well-informed public opinion, willing to work for peace; now

CHARLES E. LUTZICH W. YERGEN, Governor of the State of Minnesota do hereby proclaim the week of September 14 to 20, 1947, as

"UNITED NATIONS WEEK"

and, in keeping with the theme: The individual's responsibility in the United Nations, I call upon all citizens to join in public discussions and exercises which will foster a better understanding and appreciation of the values of the United Nations and create new bonds of friendship between ourselves and other peace-loving people of the world.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol in St. Paul this eleventh day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred forty-seven and of the state the ninetieth.
