

AN ORDINANCE EXTENDING THE BOUNDARIES OF THE VILLAGE OF YOUNG AMERICA, CARVER COUNTY, MINNESOTA

The Village Council of the Village of Young America do ordain as follows:

WHEREAS, the owners of the following described tract or parcel of land situate, lying and being in Carver County, Minn. and described as follows, to wit:

Commencing at the center post of Section 11, Township 115 North of Range 26 West; thence East on the East and West center line of said Section 11, a distance of 9.88 chains to a point and which said point is the place of beginning of the premises herein to be described and conveyed; thence South on a line parallel with the North and South center line of said Section a distance of 66 feet to a point; thence West at right angles with the last described line a distance of 155 feet; thence North a distance of 66 feet to the East and West center line of said Section; thence East 155 feet to the place of beginning.

Excepting therefrom that part of Trunk Highway no. 25 as the same is now constructed and established.

which said tract or parcel of land abuts upon said Village of Young America and contains less than 200 acres of land, have duly petitioned the Village Council of said Village of Young America to extend the boundaries so as to include said tract or parcel of land, which said petition was duly granted by said Village of Young America and the boundaries of said Village of Young America are hereby extended so as to include said tract or parcel of land.
