

Resolution

Whereas the village council of Cass Lake, Cass County, Minnesota, then being a duly incorporated village under the laws of Minnesota and having a population of more than two thousand inhabitants did, by resolution duly passed and approved by its council and filed with the Secretary of State of Minnesota, establish a municipal court in and for said village on June 4th., 1918, under the Revised Laws of 1905 which court has ever since functioned and now is functioning thereunder in suitable quarters provided for holding sessions of said court and the records thereof in the municipally owned village hall in said village;

And whereas the village council of said village of Cass Lake, now having a population in excess of one thousand inhabitants and in which village no municipal court existed prior to the taking effect of said Revised Laws of 1905 and prior to the establishment of the present municipal court as aforesaid, desire to adopt the provisions of Chapter 483 of Minnesota Statutes, 1945, for the future government of said municipal court, under the provisions of section 483.04 thereof and to that end and for that purpose be it,

Resolved by the village council of Cass Lake, Minnesota, that said municipal court so established and now functioning in said village shall be known as "the municipal court of the Village of Cass Lake" under the provisions of Chapter 483 of Minnesota Statutes 1941 for its future government; that sessions of said court shall be held in the municipal court rooms in the village hall, a municipally owned building in said village; that there shall be two judges to preside over said court, one to be known as municipal judge and one as special municipal judge; the municipal judge shall receive a salary of \$50.00 per month to be paid monthly by the council; the special municipal judge shall receive a per diem salary payable monthly by the council, prorated per diem on the monthly salary provided for the municipal judge, for acting during the absence or disability of the municipal judge, only, and paid by the council from the salary of the municipal judge; that said court shall have one clerk who shall be appointed by the municipal judge provided that the salary of such clerk shall be paid by the said judges and out of their salaries.

Adopted and approved this 19th day of December, 1947 by 4/5 majority of the Village Council.
