

RESOLUTION

Resolution of Appreciation

Resolved, That the science and art of engineering and its kindred basic sciences have been among the most conspicuous elements of progress during the twentieth century; and

Resolved, That the varied contributions have contributed much toward safe-guarding public health, safety and property; and

Resolved, That the nation's demonstration of its unrelenting capacity to produce, which during the last six years has astonished the world, was based on the application of sound engineering principles by competent engineers; and

Resolved, That the turning of this productive capacity, this resourcefulness and ingenuity, into the channels of recreation fitting for the achievement of still higher standards of competence, comfort and ability for all the people, is a task for which the engineering profession is admirably well equipped; and

Resolved, It is important that all our citizens recognize and acknowledge this task which constitutes much of engineering.

BEFORE ME, J. EDWARD W. HANCOCK, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby set aside and rescind the vote beginning on February 2, 1948, as

Engineers' day

and urge all citizens to give thought during that week to the contributions of engineering to the general welfare, and I do further urge them to visit the Engineering Association, at the St. Paul exhibition, in order to see there visible evidence of the recent achievements of engineers.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, I have therefore set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol in St. Paul this thirteenth day of January in the year of our Lord and of the Independence of the United States the ninetieth.
