Resolution of the Minnesota Medical Society

Resolved, that a year of studies and of every two hours in clinics and laboratories were than 187,000 operations in 1947, including 60,000 operations of the type of operations and

Resolved, that the definite toll taken by this dread disease can be reduced and finally eradicated only by the urging of a vigorous, unrelenting campaign of research and through educational and public health measures of recognizing and treating the early symptoms and

Resolved, that the American Cancer Society is sponsoring scientific research, education and services required in combating this deadly cancer and

Resolved, that research at the University of Minnesota made possible through grants by the American Cancer Society has already produced valuable clinical returns in the search for methods that will curtail the disease and

Resolved, that the Minnesota Division of the American Cancer Society has given \$100,000 towards the establishment of a cancer research center at the University of Minnesota and in new financing a cancer detection center that will serve the needs of the state and

Resolved, that the Minnesota Division of the Society is endeavoring to urge legislation to cover all these worthy efforts in the fight to eliminate the tragic losses caused by cancer.

That, therefore, I, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the month of April, 1948, as

APRIL AS CANCER MONTH

and call upon all citizens to unite in cooperation to the fullest the training and activities of the American Cancer Society.

In special session, I have signed and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed to this resolution. Done at St. Paul in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred forty-eight and of the state the ninetieth.
