A Proclamation of Aviation Week

WHEREAS, the progress of aviation is vital to our national security and to the commercial development of our resources; and

WHEREAS, Minnesota has become a hub of national and international air routes and is making significant strides in the development and improvement of airports and landing fields; and

WHEREAS, it is highly essential that every possible effort be made to further stimulate interest in aviation so that there may be continued development of this important resource of the State; and

WHEREAS, the 1948 Northwest Aviation Exposition provides an opportunity to observe the newest products of aviation research and to thus encourage public interest in aeronautical achievements;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, LUTHER W. YOUNGBLAD, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of April 17 through April 24, 1948 as

"AVIATION WEEK"

and commend the 1948 Northwest Aviation Exposition being held during that period of time as an event worthy of the attention of all citizens interested in the progress of the aviation industry.
