A Proclamation of "National Pharmacy Week"

WHEREAS, the pharmacists of our State perform services which are essential to the protection of the health of the people; and

WHEREAS, it is appropriate that we should devote one week of the year as a tribute to our conscientious pharmacists in recognition of the faithful and vital service which they daily give; and

WHEREAS, this year will mark the twenty-first observance of National Pharmacy Week; and

WHEREAS, the American Pharmaceutical Association has dedicated the National Pharmacy Week for 1948 to the high purpose of carrying out a program of public education to help in the control of cancer, the dread disease which kills 100,000 annually in America;

I, FREDERICK J. SIEVER W. YOUNGBLOOD, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week beginning April 16, 1948 as

"National Pharmacy Week"
