LETTER, DATED APRIL 30, 1948, FROM LUTHER W. YOUNGDHAL, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA,
IN WHICH HE PROCLAMES CITIZENSHIP DAY, MAY 16, 1948, AS

"A DAY OF APPRECIATION"
