A Proclamation of "Child Health Day"

WHEREAS, parents are eager to protect their children against unnecessary handicaps such as poor dental or physical health; and

WHEREAS, the benefit of infants has been recognized through regular medical examination; and

WHEREAS, continued good health in the years following infancy can be achieved by the prevention or early discovery and remedy of defects; and

WHEREAS, it is important for children's progress in school that they maintain the best possible state of physical, mental and emotional health; and

WHEREAS, the first day of May is traditionally designated by the Congress of the United States as Child Health Day;

LET IT THEREFORE BE ORDERED, that GUY VANDERKAM, Governor of the State of Minnesota,
do hereby designate the first day May, 1948 as

"CHILD HEALTH DAY"

and do unto parents, doctors, dentists, nurses and other health workers to provide pre-school children with periodic medical and dental examinations at least annually, as at now every biennially,

In WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol in St. Paul this thirtieth day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and forty-eight and of the State the ninetieth.
