PROCLAMATION

A Proclamation of Mother's Day

WHEREAS, the annual observance of Mother's Day has become one of our most beautiful and inspirational traditions; and

WHEREAS, it is fitting that our own Mothers and all Mothers of the Nation should have this special day set aside in their honor as an expression of our deep affection; and

WHEREAS, the day should cause us to pause in the midst of a busy world and to contemplate mother's sacrificial role in our nation and the great debt which we owe her and to resolve to spare ourselves ever lastingly of her unbounded love and trust;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, FRANK B. ROWLAND, Governor of the State of Minnesota do hereby proclaim Sunday, May 9, 1948 as

MOTHER'S DAY

and urge all Minnesota men and women to dedicate the day in tribute to Mother, as indication of our love and gratitude to her. I further invite our citizens to share with the American War Mothers in their role of Mother's Day earnestness and request that the American flag be displayed on public buildings, as provided by Congressional Resolution.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and cause the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol in St. Paul this sixth day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred forty-eight and of the state the ninetieth.
