Be it known that on the 1st day of March, 1948, a petition for the organization of the Becker County Soil Conservation District, signed by more than twenty-five land occupiers was duly filed in the office of the State Soil Conservation Committee;

That on the 24th day of March, 1948, at Lake Park, public hearing was held after due notice of the said hearing had been given as required by law;

That on the 26th day of March, 1948, the State Soil Conservation Committee did duly determine that there is need in the interest of the public health, safety and welfare, for a soil conservation district to function in the proposed territory and did define the boundaries thereof;

That thereafter due notice was given of a referendum to be held within the territory so defined by the Committee on the question of the creation of the said district;

That the said referendum was held within the defined boundaries on the 20th day of April, 1948;

That the result of the referendum showed that a majority of the votes cast in the said referendum were in favor of the creation of the said district;







Be it known that on the 4th day of May, 1950, a petition for the inclusion of additional territory within the Becker County Soil Conservation District, signed by more than twenty-five land occupiers was duly filed in the office of the State Soil Conservation Committee:

That on the 4th day of May, 1950, the State Soil Conservation Committee did duly determine that there is need in the interest of the public health, safety and welfare, for including the additional territory within the Becker County Soil Conservation District and did define the boundaries of such additional territory;

That thereafter due notice was given of a referendum to be held within the territory so defined by the Committee on the question of inclusion of said territory within the said district;

That the said referendum was held within the said defined boundaries on the 6th day of June, 1950:

That the result of the said referendum showed that a majority of the votes cast in the said referendum were in favor of the inclusion of said additional territory within the said district;
