A Proclamation of "Shut-in's Day"

WHEREAS the first Sunday in June is being sponsored as SHUT-IN'S DAY by the United States of America Chapter of the Shut-in's Day Association International, with the cooperation of shut-in societies, physically-handicapped organizations, churches of all denominations, civic clubs and business associations, for the purpose of encouraging the public to remember those sick and disabled persons, veterans and civilians alike, who are confined to their homes, or are in hospitals, sanatoria, or other institutions for the care of the sick; and

WHEREAS, this special day will bring cheer and comfort to many of the less fortunate in Minnesota through the efforts of Shut-in Clubs and other organizations in our state;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, LUTHER W. YONGEDALE, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Sunday, June 6 as

SHUT-IN'S DAY

and urge all citizens to observe the day by remembering the sick and disabled through personal visits, gifts, messages and other acts of kindness.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol in St. Paul this first day June in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred forty-eight and of the state the ninety-first.
