A Message to Minnesotans

- WHEREAS, There are 20 Minnesota newspapers (16,413 persons) who are physically handicapped, many of whom, though crippled, are not completely under their doctor's care, and
- WHEREAS, About 20,000 persons physically impaired do highway maintenance and an additional 3,000 physically disabled constituents may of time become disabled, and
- WHEREAS, Other thousands of men and women live normal lives in the nation's necessary establishments, during which period they incurred physical disabilities, and are now undergoing rehabilitation, and
- WHEREAS, The State of Minnesota can ill afford any loss of the talents of physically handicapped persons, and
- WHEREAS, The State of Minnesota has a profound responsibility obligation to help physically handicapped persons to become independent, self-supporting, and productive in living with their more fortunate type, and
- WHEREAS, Public Law 276, your Congress, provides that the first week in October of each year shall be designated as NATIONAL REHABILITATION WEEK, to be proclaimed by the President, with participation of other government and private agencies now

WHEREAS, I, LUTHER W. YOUNGDAHL, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of October 3 to 9, 1948, as

NATIONAL REHABILITATION WEEK
and call upon all public officials, employees, labor organizations, civic groups and all other citizens to join in this program to help give suitable opportunity to our physically handicapped.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol in St. Paul this twenty-first day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and forty-eight and of the State, one thousand seven hundred and twenty-two.
