A Proclamation for "Remembrance Day"

WHEREAS, the American War and Civil War United organizations have designated one day of the year as "Remembrance Day" in devotion to the memory of the honored men and daughters who gave their lives in the service of their country and

WHEREAS, it is most fitting that all citizens should join in this grateful remembrance and consecrated tribute to those men and daughters of our state and nation who made the supreme sacrifice so that we might enjoy the blessings of peace and the privileges of freedom and

WHEREAS, the centry preceding the anniversary of the attack on Pearl Harbor has been set aside for a national expression of gratitude to memory of our fallen heroes;

I, THOMAS W. WELCH, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Sunday, December 6, as

"REMEMBRANCE DAY"

and urge all citizens to join in the observance of this occasion in our churches and homes with a spirit of reverent gratitude to the heroic men and daughters who gave their lives for us and the future of the nation they loved.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol in Saint Paul this third day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and forty-eight and of the State, the sixty-first.
