


KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That I, J. A. A. Burnquist, Attorney General of the State of Minnesota, by virtue of the authority vested in me by statute, and particularly by authority of Minnesota Statutes 1945, Section 8.06, do hereby constitute and appoint John H. Burwell of Minneapolis, Minnesota as Special Attorney for the Department of Conservation with the title of Special Assistant Attorney General, and I hereby fix his compensation in the sum of Five Thousand Eight Hundred Thirty-six Dollars (\$5,836) per year, said sum to be paid by the Department of Conservation; said appointment to commence on January 3, 1949, and said appointee to serve at the pleasure of the Attorney General or until this commission shall be revoked or otherwise terminated in accordance with law.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand at St. Paul, Minnesota, this 3rd day of January, 1949.


