CERTIFICATE OF INSPECTORS

We, the undersigned Inspectors (appointed by the County Board and acting as Judges) of a Special Election held January 18th, 1949, between 8:00 a. m. and 8:00 p. m. at School District No. 17, in the School Building, also known as Lauderdale School, located on the Southwest corner of Spring and Eastis Streets, on the "Proposed Incorporation of the Village of Lauderdale" hereby certify as follows:

WHEREAS, A petition was, on December 6th, 1948, filed with the Board of
County Commissioners of Ramsey County, Minnesota, praying that the following described
territory, to-wit:

Commencing at center line of Como Avenue, West and West line of Section 20,
Township 29, Range 23, thence North along West lines of Section 20 and 17
to Northwest corner of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 17 being the center line of Rose-
lawn Avenue, thence East on North line of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ to Northeast Corner of
SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of said Section 17, thence South along East lines of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section
17 and the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 20 to the South line of the N $\frac{1}{2}$ of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec-
tion 20, thence West to point of beginning, containing 240 acres, more or
less,

be and they are hereby appointed inspectors to act as judges of said election and are
directed to conduct the same in accordance with the statutes in such case made and pro-
vided and insofar as practicable in accordance with the laws regulating the election
of town officers,

hereby directed to cause copies of the said petition, together with a notice of said
election to be posted in three public places within said territory.

TO THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, RAMSEY COUNTY, MINNESOTA

PETITION

We, the undersigned residents, electors and voters all having resided continuously for more than two years last past within the territory hereinafter described, desiring to incorporate said territory into a village, do hereby petition the Board of County Commissioners in and for Ramsey County, Minnesota to call an election pursuant to law (Sections 412.02 and 412.03 M S A) for the purpose of the determination of the proposed incorporation.

The territory to be incorporated is the following described land, situated in the County of Ramsey, State of Minnesota and bounded as follows:

Commencing at center line of Como Avenue, West and West line of Section 20, Township 29, Range 23, thence North along West lines of Section 20 and 17 to Northwest corner of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 17 being center line of Roselawn Avenue, thence East on North line of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ to Northeast corner of SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of said Section 17, thence South along East lines of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 17 and the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 20 to the South line of the N $\frac{1}{2}$ of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 20, thence West to point of beginning, containing 240 acres, more or less, a plat of which is hereto attached and made a part hereof, the territory proposed to be incorporated being shown within the red lines on said plat.

Included within the area are ten (10) plats duly and legally certified according to the laws of this State, and filed in the Office of the Register of Deeds in and for Ramsey County, Minnesota, containing 140 acres, more or less, namely, Rose Hill Addition; Lauderdale's East Side Addition; Pease's Subdivision; Rose Hill Garden Lots; Manuel's Subdivision; Pease's Rearrangement of Lots 3, 4, 7 and 8 of Prospect Hill; Manuel's Addition; Manuel's Rearrangement; Sather's Addition and Oak Wood.

The said platted areas are largely used for residential purposes. A large portion of the unplatted area is divided into small miscellaneous descriptions and has been so conveyed and is being largely used for residential purposes. A small portion of the unplatted area is industrial. The Southerly line of said area is adjacent to the limits of the City of St. Paul, while the Westerly line is adjacent to the limits of the City of Minneapolis. The unplatted part of the territory adjoins the platted portions thereof and the entire area is used, conditioned and developed so as to be properly subjected to village government.

A census of the resident population of the said area or territory was accurately taken on December 2nd, 1948 and the number of actual residents is 1,056.

The proposed name of the village is LAUDERDALE .

Attached hereto and made a part hereof are the oaths of three of the said petitioners verifying the accuracy of the census and the truths of the statements made herein.
