A Proclamation for "Temperance Sunday"

WHEREAS, it is traditional to set aside one Sunday of the year so that we may recommit ourselves to temperance, as a most worthy and necessary virtue for all mankind; and

WHEREAS, Temperance is recognized as essential by all who would develop and live by a sound philosophy of life, making the fullest and best use of the spiritual, mental and physical resources of the individual; and

WHEREAS, adults have a continuous challenge to set for the youth of our state the proper example, which will guide them to the formation of necessary habits of temperance;

Now, therefore, I, Luther W. Youngquist, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim May 1, 1940, as

"TEMPERANCE SUNDAY"

and call upon our church, schools and appropriate civic agencies to observe this special day through programs and ceremonies stressing the importance of temperance.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol in Saint Paul this twenty-first day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and forty-nine and of the state, the ninety-first.
