

ORDINANCE NO. 2

AN ORDINANCE CHANGING THE NAME OF
THE VILLAGE OF MAPLEWOODS TO
THE VILLAGE OF WOODLAND


The Village Council of the Village of Maplewoods do
ordain as follows:

Section 1: The Village Council hereby determines that
20 per cent of the legal voters of the Village of Maplewoods
have petitioned the Village Council of said Village for a
change of its name, and the question of such change of name
has been duly submitted by the Village Council to the voters of
the Village in a special election in said Village on the 15th
day of January, 1949; and the Village Council having duly can-
vassed the votes cast on such question at said election have
determined that a majority of all votes cast upon the question
are in favor of such change.


Section 2: The name of the Village of Maplewoods
shall be hereby changed to the Village of Woodland and shall
no longer be designated as the Village of Maplewoods.

Section 3: This ordinance shall take effect from
and after its publication and the filing of a certified copy
thereof with the County Auditor of Hennepin County, the Secre-
tary of State and the State Auditor of the State of Minnesota
are required by law.
