

"At a Regular meeting of the Village Council, of the Village of Maple Lake, in Wright County, State of Minnesota, held in the Council Room, at which all members were present, the passage of the following resolution was moved by Trustee Kotilinek and seconded by trustee Madigan, and upon a roll call all members having voted in the affirmative, the resolution was declared carried, to wit:

"Whereas, at a Special meeting of the Village Council held on the ninth day of January, 1913, a resolution was duly passed proposing the relinquishment of the Charter of the Village of Maple Lake under the Gen. Laws of 1885, Chap 145, and Re-Incorporation under Chap 9 Rev. Laws, 1905, and directing that a Special Election be held for the purpose of Voting on such re-incorporation, on the 28th. day of Jan. 1913, and

Whereas due notice of such Election was given by posted and published Notice as required by law, and

Whereas it appears from the minutes of such Special Election which was duly held in the Village Hall on the 28th. day of January, 1913, that there were 52 votes cast thereat on such question of re-incorporation, and that forty six (46) votes were cast in favor of Re-Incorporation, and Six (6) votes were cast against the same, and it appearing that a majority of the votes cast at such election were in favor of such Re-Incorporation,

Now Therefore be it resolved, that pursuant to the result of such Special Election the question of Re-Incorporation as submitted thereat, was duly carried and is hereby declared to have been carried, and that the Charter of the Village of Maple Lake heretofore existing under the provisions of Chapter 145 Gen. Laws of Minn. for the year 1885, was and is hereby relinquished, and that said Village of Maple Lake is hereby declared to be and the same is duly re-incorporated under the provisions of Chapter 9 Rev. Laws 1905".

Came personally before me, A. W. Nary, and being duly sworn, deposes and says, that during all the time hereinafter mentioned he was the editor, printer and manager of the Maple Lake Messenger, a weekly newspaper, printed and published in the Village of Maple Lake in said county; that he knows of his own knowledge that the printed notice of Notice of Special Election

MINUTES OF SPECIAL ELECTION

(a) The lines following the letter (a) in this blank are left to write in the fact, that "the electors present at the time and place named for opening the polls, elected the judges *viva voce*, because the Council had neglected to make such appointment," or "because the persons so appointed neglected or refused to serve" (if such was the case).

At a Special Election of the Village of Maple Lake
in the County of Wright and State of Minnesota, held at the
Village Hall the same being the place where it was directed to be held by
the Village Council after giving due notice thereof as provided by law, on the 28th
day of January 1913, John Kotilinek
and Thomas Muelgan two qualified voters of said Village,
who had within twenty days before such time, been designated and appointed by the Village Council to act as
Judges of such Election, (a)

who being present with the Recorder at the hour of 10 o'clock A.M., each of them duly took and
subscribed an oath to faithfully discharge the duties required of them at such election,
and the said Judges and Clerk being duly qualified, forthwith opened the polls by proclamation and the
election proceeded by ballot without adjournment or intermission until closed.

The subjects voted on at such election, as stated in the Notice thereof, were: was
To elect "That the Charter of the Village of Maple
Lake, under Chap. 14.5 Gen. Laws of Minn.
1885, and acts amendatory thereof, be
Relinquished, and that the said Village of
Maple Lake, be re-incorporated under the
Provisions of Chap. 9 Rev. Laws 1905, and
acts amendatory thereof.

At four o'clock in the afternoon of said day the polls were closed, proclamation thereof having
been made by one of the Judges thirty minutes previous thereto. The Judges then proceeded to publicly
count and canvass the votes, and continued without intermission until complete and the result declared.

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
