A Resolution for "Aids" Day in Minnesota

- WHEREAS, the people of Minnesota are vitally interested in youth and recognize the importance of adult participation in matters pertaining to the welfare of our children; and
- WHEREAS, one of the principal tasks facing our nation and our state is the building of youth into useful and honorable citizens; and
- WHEREAS, it is fitting that we make every effort to keep all children from being prey to any form of delinquency and to foster all good and proper endeavors aimed at helping youth to achieve the benefits of the American way of life; and
- WHEREAS, through the joint efforts of Kiwanis International and the National Aids' Day Foundation as represented by our local Kiwanis Clubs, a day has been set aside to focus attention upon the needs and accomplishments of youth at the national, state and community levels; and
- WHEREAS, the purpose of the day is to provide, wherever possible, consolation to helping underprivileged children enjoy some of the benefits normally accorded to boys and girls in more fortunate circumstances;

I, **ARTHUR J. LUTHE**, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby designate Saturday, November 13, as

"AIDS" DAY IN MINNESOTA

and do call upon all citizens to support the objectives of the day and to cooperate to the best of their abilities in making the event a success.
