

ORDINANCE NO. 20

AN ORDINANCE ANNEXING CERTAIN LOTS AND BLOCKS TO THE
VILLAGE OF ST. JOSEPH, MINN.

The Village Council of the Village of St. Joseph do Ordain as follows:

Section 1.- That the following described lots and blocks, or parts thereof, abutting upon the incorporated village of St. Joseph, Stearns County, Minnesota, be, and the same hereby are, annexed to such village, and shall become a part of such village to the same effect as if they had been originally a part thereof.

Said lots and blocks are situate in Stearns County, Minnesota, described as follows, to-wit:

All of Lots Five (5) and Six (6) east of the village limits, and all of Lots Seven (7), Eight (8), Nine (9) and Ten (10), all in Block One (1) of Loco's Second Addition to St. Joseph, according to the plat of such Addition on file and of record in the office of the Register of Deeds in and for said county, together with all portions of the streets and alleys in such addition adjoining and abutting upon said property.

Sec. 2.- This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication.
