

CERTIFICATE OF ADOPTION OF AMENDMENT TO
THE HOME RULE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF CHISHOLM,
ST. LOUIS COUNTY, MINNESOTA

EXECUTED IN DUPLICATE

I, Alfred Maturi, do hereby certify as follows: That I am the Mayor and the Chief Magistrate of the City of Chisholm, St. Louis County, Minnesota, having been duly elected and qualified to act as such; that at a General City Election duly held in this city on the 6th day of December, 1949, the following question having been duly submitted to the electorate of said City of Chisholm by the Charter Commission (Board of Freeholders) and that said question received the number of votes as indicated herein and the same receiving more than the required number of votes to carry and that said City Council of said city having duly canvassed the result of said election with the results as hereinafter stated, to-wit:

Shall Section 148 of the Home Rule Charter of the City of Chisholm be amended to read as follows:

"Section 148. Commissioners. The control, management and operation of all such water, heat, power, gas and light plants or buildings constituting a part thereof shall be committed to a board to be known as the "Water and Light Commission."

Provided that the management, care and control of all buildings and all property except as otherwise provided in this charter, shall be completely vested in the City Council; and provided further that the construction, erection, extension, management, maintenance and operation of the sewer system of the city or of any sewage disposal plant in conjunction therewith shall be under the exclusive jurisdiction of the City Council?" That said question received 2373 Yes votes and 880 No votes;

As Mayor of said City of Chisholm, St. Louis County, Minnesota, I hereby certify said charter amendment to have been adopted.
