- WHEREAS, George Washington Garver was one of the greatest scientists in the history of our nation; and
 - WHEREAS, during his lifetime, George Washington Garver set an example of selfless service to God and his fellow men; and
 - WHEREAS, our nation and the entire world continue to reap benefits from the many discoveries which he made; and
 - WHEREAS, the National Achievement Clubs will sponsor on January 5, the anniversary of this great scientist's death in 1888, a memorial program in his honor; and
 - WHEREAS, this day has been set aside as "Garver Day" by act of Congress and Presidential proclamation;
- BEFORE, THOMAS E. LUTHER, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim January 5, 1950 as

"GARVER DAY"

in honor of this great American scientist, to whom we are indebted for so many priceless discoveries and developments that have improved our way of life.
