A Proclamation for "Children's Dental Health Day in Minnesota"

WHEREAS, one of our foremost responsibilities is that of safeguarding the health of our children; and

WHEREAS, tooth decay, especially in children, is a prevalent physical disorder which, if not given proper attention, will inevitably lead to more serious consequences affecting the general health of the individual; and

WHEREAS, dentistry is a health service profession dedicated to the promotion and preservation of oral health through the media of research, prevention and various operative procedures; and

WHEREAS, the dentists of Minnesota desire to contribute to the general health and well-being of children by helping to conduct an effective program of dental health education and to stress the importance of regular and adequate professional care of the teeth; and

WHEREAS, the Minnesota State Dental Association has, accordingly, planned a special day of activities to call attention to the need for better dental health for the children of the state;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, LUTHER W. YOUNGquist, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Monday, February 6, 1950, as

"CHILDREN'S DENTAL HEALTH DAY IN MINNESOTA"

and urge all citizens, schools and youth agencies to join with the State Dental Health Association in this observance, which is sponsored to help improve the dental health of our children.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol in Saint Paul this nineteenth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty and of the state, the Ninety-second.
