## 1. Proclamation for "National Thrift Week"

SUMMARY. The orderly-observed annual celebration of National Thrift Week will be observed throughout the nation from January 17th to 23rd, 1950, concluding on the birthday of Benjamin Franklin, with special emphasis on the importance of free enterprise, individual freedom and planned security through a voluntary program of systematic savings and wise money management; and

PURPOSE. It is wished that the citizens of the state of Minnesota take advantage of these type bent dated as they may rightfully be proud of the historical past their pioneers played in the growth of this country through hard work, industry, diligence and economy and

IDEALS. THRIFT is basic to all material growth, and it is fitting and proper that we take in respect the birthday of Benjamin Franklin - who has so aptly been called the Father of Thrift; and

PROGRAM. A seven point program for 1950 is recommended by the National Thrift Committee, owners of National Thrift Week, as follows:

1. REGULAR SAVING IN SAVINGS ACCOUNTS FROM EVERY PAY CHECK.
2. PLANNED SPENDING FROM A SENSIBLE BUDGET.
3. PAYMENT OF BILLS PROMPTLY AND FAITHFULLY.
4. AUTOMATIC OR AUTOMATIC PAYMENT BY SETTING ASIDE PARTS FROM EVERY PAY CHECK.
5. BANK OWNERSHIP AS A FORM OF SAVINGS AND A GOAL FOR SAVING.
6. SAVINGS TO PROTECT AGAINST LIFE'S UNCERTAINTIES.
7. U. S. SAVINGS BONDS purchased and held to maturity.

Gov. BERNARD E. WENGER, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby designate the period of January 17th to January 23rd, 1950, as

## "NATIONAL THRIFT WEEK"

and urge each citizen of Minnesota to join in this observance and receive such as safeguard his or her future security and the economic stability of our nation by making Thrift a rule of conduct throughout the year of 1950.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this seventh day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred fifty and of the state, the Ninety-second.
