A Proclamation in memory of George Alvin Edison

electric power distribution, the phonograph, the motion
picture as well as other new industries which created new
jobs and comforts for millions of people; and

WHEREAS, his life and work serve as an enduring example of the
great good which can be achieved under our American system of
individual initiative--an example not only for Americans but
for the peoples of the world; and

WHEREAS, his contributions to the American way of life continue to
grow with the years and enrich the lives of us all; now

THE STATE SENATE, I, LUTHER W. YOUNGDAHL, Governor of the State of
Minnesota do hereby proclaim February 11, the 111th anniversary of
the Inventor's birth, as

THE GEORGE ALVIN EDISON DAY
