A Proclamation for "Loyalty Day"

WHEREAS, it is proper and fitting that a day be designated specially for stimulating and inspiring a greater love of country and flag and for the purpose of accentuating the confidence of the people in and support of our National Government and the Constitution of the United States, and

WHEREAS, it is highly desirable that the citizens of this great nation, by patriotic assembly, express their loyalty to American ideal and traditions of freedom, and

WHEREAS, the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States is the principal sponsor of the observance of LOYALTY DAY on May 1, 1950, and seeks to have the significance of this occasion brought to the attention of the general public;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ARTHUR W. TOWNSEND, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Monday, May 1, 1950 as

"LOYALTY DAY"

and urge all to participate in such observance as will effectively note the observance.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol in Saint Paul this twenty-ninth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty and of the state, the ninety-second.
