A Proclamation for "National and Inter-American Music Week"

WHEREAS, we in Minnesota can be proud of our many fine orchestras, choruses, bands and artists of national and world reputation;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, LUTHER W. YOUNGDAHL, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of May 7 to May 10 as

"NATIONAL AND INTER-AMERICAN MUSIC WEEK"

and urge all citizens to observe this week by furthering our music culture and encouraging more people to take advantage of the enjoyment which music brings.
