A Proclamation for "National Mental Health Week" *Mike Foley* Secretary of State

WHEREAS, mental illness is America's number one public health problem, being twice as prevalent as cancer and fifteen times more widespread than tuberculosis, and

WHEREAS, those suffering from various forms of mental illness still more beds than the total in our general hospitals, and

WHEREAS, unless preventive and research programs are successfully instituted, one out of every five families will be represented by a member in a mental hospital, and

WHEREAS, the care of the mentally ill is one of the greatest responsibilities and social problems of the people of Minnesota, and

WHEREAS, due to the compassion of the people of Minnesota and the unanimous support of their duly elected legislators, Minnesota is embarked on a program of prevention and treatment that has caused the eyes of the world to focus on us, and

WHEREAS, National Mental Health Week is being observed throughout the country during the week of April 23rd to April 29th,

THE GOVERNOR, L. EVERETT R. TUNNELL, GOVERNOR OF MINNESOTA, call upon the citizens of our state and the leaders of the mental health drive to observe

"NATIONAL MENTAL HEALTH WEEK"

LET:

1. Contemplation of the obligation of society to its sick members
2. Visits to the tax-supported hospitals for the mentally ill, mentally deficient, and epileptic
3. Attention to the great need for prevention, and
4. Participation in the Mental Health Week activities of the many voluntary and citizens' agencies committed to the long-range task of giving Minnesota a modern mental health program.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this eighteenth day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty and of the state, the ninety-second.
