- WHEREAS, it is most fitting that we set aside a day in which to give special honor and recognition to mothers and their contributions to our state and nation; and
- WHEREAS, the observance of Mother's Day provides an opportunity for us to unite in paying heartfelt tribute to the sanctity and glory of motherhood; and
- WHEREAS, on this day we should be mindful of the great worth of a Mother's love, of her devotion to family, of the priceless values she gives in unselfish guidance and inspiration to her children;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, LUTHER W. YOUNGDAHL, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Sunday, May 14, 1950, as

"MOTHER'S DAY"

so that all Minnesota sons and daughters may express their love and gratitude to their mothers. I further invite all citizens to again share with the American War Mothers in their sale of Mother's Day Carnations, and request that the American Flag be displayed on public buildings, as provided by Congressional Resolution.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol in Saint Paul this twenty-sixth day of April in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and fifty and of the State, the ninety-second.
