A Proclamation for "Child Health Day"

WHEREAS, since 1923 the first day of May has been devoted to a consideration of the health needs of the children in our nation; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with this custom and a joint resolution by the Congress, the President of the United States has designated May 1 as Child Health Day; and

WHEREAS, we recognize that the future of our state and nation depends directly upon our efforts to advance the total health of all children--their physical, mental and emotional well-being; and

WHEREAS, the Minnesota Department of Health will give leadership to the observance of Child Health Day in the State and will present a special broadcast dealing with the subject "Health for a Million Children in Minnesota" as a feature of the activities on May 1;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, LUTHER W. YOUNGDAHL, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim May 1 as

"CHILD HEALTH DAY"

and urge all agencies, organizations and citizens to participate in the program for this day by considering how to better help our children obtain the benefits of good health in every community of our state. I encourage all citizens to listen to the broadcast by the State Health Department over station KUOM at 5:30 p.m. on that day in order to gain further information about the health needs of the children of Minnesota.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol in Saint Paul this twenty-sixth day of April in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and fifty and of the State, the ninety-second.
