


KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That I, J. A. A. Burnquist, Attorney General of the State of Minnesota, by virtue of the authority vested in me by statute, and particularly by authority of Minnesota Statutes 1949, Section 8.06, and upon the request of Chester S. Wilson, Commissioner of Conservation, do hereby constitute and appoint Thomas M. Quayle of St. Paul, Minnesota, as Special Assistant Attorney General for the Department of Conservation, and I hereby fix his compensation in the sum of Three Thousand Nine Hundred Dollars (\$3,900) per year, said sum to be paid by the Department of Conservation; said appointment to commence May 1, 1950, and said appointee to serve at the pleasure of the Attorney General or until this commission shall be revoked or otherwise terminated in accordance with law.

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand at St. Paul, Minnesota, this 28th day of April, 1950.




