A Proclamation for "World Trade Week in Minnesota"

WHEREAS, the week of May 21 to May 27 has been designated as a time for national observance of the importance of world trade; and

WHEREAS, world trade makes possible better living standards for all participating nations and promotes peaceful international relations; and

WHEREAS, we recognize that the furtherance of world trade is of vital importance to the continued progress and prosperity of our state, as well as of the nation and the world; and

WHEREAS, observance of World Trade Week can serve to remind us of the interdependence of nations and the benefits of increased efforts to promote the exchange of goods between nations;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, THOMAS W. WASSBORN, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of May 21 to May 27 as

"WORLD TRADE WEEK IN MINNESOTA"

and invite all citizens to join in the study and consideration of the importance of international trade to the American economy and to the prosperity and well-being of our own state.
