

that George Kapsambelis
has been appointed Consul General of Greece at Chicago, Illinois,*

*I do hereby recognize him as such, and declare him free to exercise and enjoy such
functions, powers and privileges as are allowed to the Consul General of the
most favored Nations in the United States.*

*In testimony whereof, I have caused these Letters to be made Patent, and the Seal of the
United States to be hereunto affixed.*

*I gave at the City of Washington this sixth day of March
in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty and of the
Independence of the United States of America, the one hundred and seventy-fourth.*
