A Proclamation for "National Home Week in Minnesota"

- WHEREAS, National Home Week will be celebrated throughout the United States this year during the period of September 13 to 17; and
- WHEREAS, the provision of good housing for every family is one of the recognized goals of our people and home ownership is one of the foundations of American life; and
- WHEREAS, the private home builder, with the help of financial, supply and sales institutions, whose services he brings together, has broken all building records in recent years; and
- WHEREAS, through the efforts of this industry our state has been provided with new homes and new neighborhoods; and
- WHEREAS, this industry has added and estimated here ownership to the general benefit of all of our citizens;

AND, WHEREAS, I, LUTHER B. WHEELER, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby officially proclaim the week of September 13 to 17, 1950, as

NATIONAL HOME WEEK

to the end that our citizens with the rest of the nation, better can be informed as to the importance of the home and home ownership in their lives and to their community and can observe the great progress in accomplishments that have been brought about by the home building industry. I urge our people to visit the homes that will be open for inspection in our state to view at first hand the kind of materials now available and being used under modern building practices and to learn of the permanent contributions being made to our welfare by home builders and others associated with them in this important enterprise.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the great seal of the state of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this seventeenth day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty and of the State the ninety-third.
