A Proclamation for "American Education Week"

WHEREAS, this year marks the thirtieth annual observance of American Education Week; and

WHEREAS, the nation-wide observance of this special week calls our attention to the importance of our schools as the mainstay of our free government; and

WHEREAS, our schools are essential to the preservation of our heritage of freedom, to the building of national unity and to the developing of the human resources upon which our strength and greatness depend; and

WHEREAS, the theme of American Education Week for 1950 is "Government of, by, and for the people;" and

WHEREAS, our schools are the basis of this form of government and it is, therefore, appropriate that we observe the week by reviewing the aims, history and achievements of the schools, by studying the needs of schools, and by striving to arouse greater public interest in making school improvements and strengthening home and school relationships;

I, THEREFORE, I, LEONARD W. LOUHEVAARA, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim November 6 to 11, 1950, as

"AMERICAN EDUCATION WEEK"

and urge all citizens to join in this observance by visiting their community schools and volunteering themselves to efforts for the continued strengthening of our educational facilities.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this twenty-ninth day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty and of the state, the ninety-third.
