PROCLAMATION

A PROCLAMATION FOR VICTORY DAY

WHEREAS, on November 11, 1918, Comdt Gen J. Pershing came to an armistice the signing of the Armistice that brought an end to the Great War of World War I and

WHEREAS, it is now fitting that we should observe the anniversary of this great event in tribute to the valiant men whose unyielding resolution made this victory possible; and

WHEREAS, in deep appreciation of the debt owed to those who fought and died to preserve our way of life, the State of Minnesota has set aside November 11 of each year as a legal holiday and

WHEREAS, our state law provide that no public business shall be transacted on this day;

Now, therefore, I, EUGENE T. MURKIN, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim October, November 11, 1950,

VICTORY DAY

and urge all citizens to join in appropriate observances in gratitude to those who helped bring the victory of that war. I urge that all businesses be closed, as well as all public offices, as a solemn commemoration of this anniversary day.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have caused this my hand and signed the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this thirty-first day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty and of the state, the ninety-third.
