EXECUTIVE ORDER

A Proclamation for "Armistice Day"

Whereas, on November 11, 1918, World War I came to an end with the signing of the Armistice that brought new hope for the cause of world peace and democracy; and

Whereas, it is most fitting that we should observe the anniversary of this great event in tribute to the valiant and those unselfish sacrifices made this victory possible; and

Whereas, in deep appreciation of the debt owed to those who fought and died to preserve our way of life, the state of Minnesota has set aside November 11 of each year as a legal holiday and

Whereas, our state laws provide that no public business shall be transacted on that day;

I, FREDERICK J. WISNIEWSKI, GOVERNOR of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Saturday, November 11, 1950,

"ARMISTICE DAY"

and urge all citizens to join in appropriate observances in tribute to those who helped bring the victory of that war. I urge that all businesses be closed, as well as all public offices, in a statewide commemoration of this memorable day.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this first day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty and of the state, the sixty-third.
