A Proclamation for "United Nations Week"

WHEREAS, the United Nations General Assembly, in 1947, unanimously adopted a resolution declaring October 24 to be celebrated as United Nations Day, and

WHEREAS, the week of October 17 through October 24 is to be devoted to making known to the peoples of the world the aims and achievements of the United Nations and to gaining their support for its work, and

WHEREAS, the United Nations is the only world force for the conciliation, mediation, and peaceful settlement of dispute and for restoring peace when peace is broken, and

WHEREAS, the United Nations has proved itself the only meeting place in which great and small countries still can freely voice the aspirations of their peoples, submit their policies and actions to the judgment of world opinion, and its support for their causes;

NOW THEREFORE, I, LUCILLE G. KIRKHAM, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of October 17 through 24, 1958, as

"UNITED NATIONS WEEK"

and October 24, 1958 as


"UNITED NATIONS DAY"

and call upon all citizens to promote the aims and purposes of the United Nations in our schools, churches, organizations, press, and radio.
