A Proclamation for "Minnesota Conservation Week" and "Litter Day"

WHEREAS, our nation is in a state of declared emergency during which unscrupulous elements are being made upon our natural resources; and

WHEREAS, all the raw materials necessary for peace and war come from far-off soil, stream water, and the sky earth and

WHEREAS, it is therefore urgent to use all measures to protect and properly manage our stock of soil, water, forests, wildlife, and minerals to ensure continued production; and

WHEREAS, in our public and private conservation agencies there is the organization and machinery to protect and manage the natural resources, provided the unanimous support of all citizens in this vital undertaking, is forthcoming;

LET, THEREFORE, I, LUCILLE V. YOUNGDALE, Governor of the State of Minnesota
do hereby designate the week of April 26th through May 3rd, 1951, as

MINNESOTA CONSERVATION WEEK
and Friday May 3rd as

"LITTER DAY"

and urge all schools, public agencies, and organizations and groups to join in this observance through appropriate ceremonies and programs of conservation education during the week and by placing trash cans and barrels for their confined uses on April 30th.
