NOW, THEREFORE, I, LUTHER H. STUADELL, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Sunday, April 20, 1952, as

FARMERS' DAY

and urge that all citizens of Minnesota on Farmers' Sunday, April 20, 1952, rededicate themselves to the task of preserving all our natural resources and, particularly, the soil, which is the basis of our entire existence.
