A Proclamation for "World Trade Week"

WHEREAS, the week of May 20 to May 26 has been designated as a special time for a nation-wide appraisal of the importance of world trade to the prosperity and progress of all people; and

WHEREAS, we should recognize that the furtherance of world trade is a means of raising the standard of living of all participating nations and a way to the developing of more peaceful international relations; and

WHEREAS, the people of Minnesota share in the great benefits that accrue from world trade;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, LUTHER W. YOUNGDAHL, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim May 20 to May 26, 1951 as

"WORLD TRADE WEEK"

and invite our citizens to join in this national observance by considering the values of world trade and studying ways by which we can further extend its benefits for ourselves and our neighbors in the world, in keeping with the slogan, "Trade Abroad - Prosper at Home".

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this eighth day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred fifty-one and of the state, the ninety-third.
