

Resolution certifying the results of a special election of the Village of Mountain Iron upon the proposition of re-organizing said village and re-incorporating under the Provisions of Chapter 9 of the Revised Laws of Minnesota for 1905, and the laws amendatory thereof.

WHEREAS, a special election was duly held in said Village of Mountain Iron on Monday, the 2nd day of June, 1913, for the purpose of voting upon the question of re-organizing said Village of Mountain Iron and re-incorporating under the Provisions of Chapter 9 of the Revised Laws of Minnesota for 1905 and the laws amendatory thereof; and

WHEREAS, The judges and clerks of said election have duly certified the returns thereof to the Village Council, and the Village Council has duly met and canvassed said returns of said special election and finds that there were 36 votes cast, of which 27 votes were cast for re-incorporation and 9 votes were cast against re-incorporation;

NOW THEREFORE, the Village Council of the Village of Mountain Iron hereby certifies that a majority of the votes cast upon the foregoing proposition were in the affirmative, and hereby declares that said proposition was carried and adopted by the voters of said Village.
